



Guidance notes on completing the 2016/17 annual return

- 1. You must apply proper practices for preparing this annual return. Proper practices are found in the Practitioners' Guide* which is updated from time to time and contains everything you should need to prepare successfully for your financial year-end and the subsequent work by the auditor. NALC, SLCC and ADA have helplines if you want to talk through any problem you encounter.
- 2. Make sure that your annual return is complete (i.e. no empty highlighted boxes), and is properly signed and dated. Avoid making amendments to the completed return. Any amendments must be approved by the smaller authority, properly initialled and explanation provided. Annual returns containing unexplained or unapproved amendments may be returned and incur additional costs.
- 3. Smaller authorities must approve Section 1 on page 2 before approving Section 2 on page 3.
- 4. Use the checklist provided below. Use a second pair of eyes, perhaps a Councillor or Board Member, to review the annual return for completeness and accuracy before sending it to the external auditor.
- 5. Do not send the external auditor any information not specifically asked for. Doing so is not helpful. However, you must tell the external auditor about any change of Clerk, Responsible Finance Officer or Chair.
- 6. Make sure that the copy of the bank reconciliation which you send to your external auditor with the annual return covers all your bank accounts. If your smaller authority holds any short-term investments, note their value on the bank reconciliation. The external auditor must be able to agree your bank reconciliation to Box 8 on the accounting statements (Section 2 on page 3). You must provide an explanation for any difference between Box 7 and Box 8. More help on bank reconciliation is available in the Practitioners' Guide*.
- 7. Explain fully significant variances in the accounting statements on page 3. Do not just send in a copy of your detailed accounting records instead of this explanation. The external auditor wants to know that you understand the reasons for all variances. Include a complete numerical and narrative analysis to support your explanation. There are a number of examples provided in the Practitioners' Guide* to assist you.
- 8. If the external auditor has to review unsolicited information, or receives an incomplete bank reconciliation, or you do not fully explain variances, this may incur additional costs for which the auditor will make a charge.
- 9. You must inform the external auditor of the date set for the commencement of the period for the exercise of public rights.
- 10. Make sure that your accounting statements add up and the balance carried forward from the previous year (Box 7 of 2016) equals the balance brought forward in the current year (Box 1 of 2017).
- 11. Do not complete Section 3 which is reserved for the external auditor.

External Auditor Report for the year ended 31 March 2017

Matters reported

Accounting statements

The Authority does not have in place proper arrangements for effective financial management during the year, and for the preparation of the accounting statements. In our view, the response to Assertion 1 on the Annual Governance Statement should be 'No'.

In future, the Authority must ensure that the accounting statements in section 2 of the Annual Return are prepared in accordance with proper practices. The failure to identify the 2015/16 imbalance of £260 and restate the figures on the 2016/17 Annual Return are a financial management failure.

Other matters not affecting our opinion which we wish to draw to the attention of the authority

Internal Audit Report

The Internal Auditor has answered 'Yes' to Objective F in relation to petty cash. This should state 'Not Covered' as the Authority does not operate a petty cash system.

The Authority should ensure that the Internal Auditor's Report is reviewed before sending the Annual Return to the external auditors. The Authority should minute this process. If there are any errors in the Internal Auditor's Report it should either be amended by the Internal Auditor, or the Authority should provide an explanation for the error.
